This set was privately produced for home use (similar to the "Crazy Legs Casino" set), and is currently being offered in some dealer offerings. If you like them for your collections, by all means buy However, please don't attempt to resell them as legitimate casino chips to unsuspecting purchasers. Also, be advised that it costs the same amount of money to produce \$1 chips as it does \$500 chips. So if you are paying an inflated price for the "high values" you may want to reconsider your buying habits. Generally, this type of material is sold by the set, or by the box of 100 pieces. 'Nuff said!
