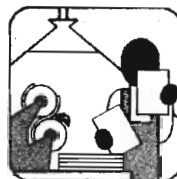

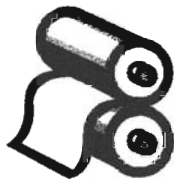

## TREASURER'S REPORT

### Fall, 1999

My first three months as Treasurer has certainly been interesting and a learning experience I was fortunate to take over from an extremely competent and organized predecessor, Chuck Tomarchio. Chuck worked closely with me prior to, during and after the convention so that the transition of the Treasurer's responsibilities was seamless and without problem. We all owe Chuck a debt of gratitude for his years of dedicated service to the club.

Let me bring all the members up to date on the important financial information of the club. As of September 5, 1999, we have a balance of \$18,897.00 in our general operating bank account. This is after accounting for all revenues and expenses from our 1999 convention and payment for the summer issue of the club magazine. We also have a balance in our money market account as of August 31, 1999 of \$33,043.00.

The financial summary of the 1999 convention shows that revenues exceeded expenses by approximately \$1000. The primary sources of revenue were table fees from dealers and proceeds from our successful auction. Expenses included the rental of the convention space, catering (primarily the opening reception), security and table rental. Thanks to the previous officers who booked and helped plan the convention and special thanks to Wayne Thompson, our Convention Chairman who was involved in the planning and expertly managed all facets of the event. Through his efforts, we were able to have a professionally run convention while adding funds to our treasury.

## Meet Your New Vice President Ken Hallenbeck

Kenneth L. Hallenbeck is purely, plainly, absolutely a collector. "I like neat stuff, and I just love collecting," he says today, nearly six decades after he first took an interest in numismatics. Despite his many successes, the 67 year old coin dealer is humbled by his selection as the 1999 recipient of the Farren Zerbe Memorial Award for Distinguished Service - the highest honor the American Numismatic Association bestows. "I never thought I would receive this award," he says. "All my work for the ANA and for numismatics was done not to receive awards, but because I love this hobby." Hallenbeck was honored at the ANA Awards Banquet on Saturday, August 14, at the 108th Anniversary Convention in Chicago.

As vigilant and relentless as he is in his own collecting pursuits, Hallenbeck is just as aggressive in his storefront business and in promoting the hobby and the ANA. "There is a synergistic benefit of having worked with and for the ANA," he says, based on his experiences as a staff member, officer and volunteer.

A member of the ANA Board of Governors for 16 years in three separate stints, including two years as president from 1989 to 1991, Hallenbeck served as museum curator from 1977 to 1983. As a Board member, he chaired the Young Numismatists, Hall of Fame, Bylaws,

Insurance, ANA Certification Service and Personnel Committees. He continues to volunteer his services to the Association in a variety of capacities, including assistant treasurer. Wherever he goes, he spreads the word about numismatics and the ANA, offering himself as a prime example of the benefits of both.

Over the years, he also joined many numismatic organizations, including the International Primitive Money Society, Love Token Society, Numismatic Literary Guild, Society of Paper Money Collectors, Society of Ration Token Collectors and Token and Medal Society. He has served as president of the Colorado-Wyoming Numismatic Association, Colorado Springs Coin Club and Colorado Spring Numismatic Association.

Hallenbeck has been recognized over the years for his service to the ANA (with the Glenn Smedley Memorial Award, Medal of Merit and Exemplary Service Award) and to the hobby (with *Numismatic News*' Numismatic Ambassador Awards and appointment as chief assayer of the Old-Time Assay Commissioners Society). In his coin shop in Colorado Springs hang a number of plaques noting his service as ANA president and general chairman of the ANA's spring convention in 1984. Also prominently displayed is his first place Archie A. Black Casino Chips and Gaming Tokens Exhibit Award bestowed last year at the ANA's convention in Portland, Oregon.

# CC&GTCC

## 11th ANNUAL MEETING, CONVENTION '99

The annual meeting of the Casino Chips & Gaming Tokens Collectors Club was called to order by Predisent Archie Black at 7:40 pm, June 17, 1999 at the Orleans Hotel and Casino, Las Vegas, Nevada.

President Black introduced the officers to the 93 Club members in attendance. Secretary Michael Knapp moved to adopt the minutes of the 1998 annual meeting published in Casino Chip and Tiken News, Vol. 11,4. After a second, the motion carried unanimously.

A report was made to the membership and distributed by Treasurer Chuck Tomarchio. During the year 1998, the Club's budget exceeded \$127,000. It spend more than it took in, losing a total of \$1,558. The Club's finances are healthy, though, and no dues increases or member benefit cutbacks are planned. A motion was made to adopt the Treasurers report, was seconded, and was passed unanimously.

Membership Officer Jim Steffner reported on teh status of membership for the year. From June of 1998 to June of 1999, the Club gained a net of 270 additional members, bringing the active total to 2,119. In the 11 year history of the Club, 4,227 members have joined, with about half of those being current members in good standing. Due in large part to the anniversary date renewal system which Membership Officer Steffner has put in place, and to his followup, renuewal rates are fruning at about 77%. The Club has members in every state (with CA, NV, NJ, NY and TX being the top five), and in nine foreign countries.

Convention Chairman Wayne Thompson reported on the preparations and status of teh 1999 convention. On the first day of the convention, 218 non-members attended the show and paid admission. Additional non-members attendance came from jcasino industry employees, who were admitted without charge upon display of an ifentifaction card or invitation from an officer.

Chairman Thompson indicated that the locationa and date for the 2000 convention are not yet settled, but are under discussion. The new board will be making the final determination based on negotiations with at least three hotels, on of which is the Orleans.

Secretary Knapp reported on the results of the balloting to approve an amendment to teh Club's Constitution, which all members in good standing recieved prior to the convention. A total of 480 ballots were cast, with 7 being invalidated becasue no choice was checked although the ballots were signed. The amendment passed by a vote of 452 to 21.

Secretary Knapp also reported on the status of the Club's chapters. During the past year, four new chapters were formed, and one chapter dissolved, bringing the total number of chpaters in good standing to 11. The newest chapter, which submitted tis application to the Secretary 15 minumtes before the annual meeting was called to order, is the Silver Strikers Chapter, formed with more than 50 members at the convention! The other new chpaters this year are N.Y. Metro, N.Y. State, and Mid-America. In addition, the current chapters are: Atlantic City, (the largest chapter, with over 200 members), Floridian, Great Lakes, Nor-Cal-NeV, Southern California, Southern Nevada, and Texas (which changed its name and scope from the Houston Chapter this year).

President Black announced the Chip of the Year (Excalibur) and Token of the Year (Golden Gate \$10 silver strike) awards, although neither casino sent representatives to receive their awards.

Recognition awards were presented to Greg Susong, (top recruiter of the year), C.T. Rodgers(Club advertising manager), Kregg Herz (magazine editor), Kevin Norris (design of the club convention chip and medal), Jim Reilly (Claims Director), Bob Pardue (Librarian), Phil Jensen (best magazine article of 1998) and the current officers.

President Black then administered the oath of office to the three new officers: President David Sarles, Secretary Barry Weintraub, and Treasurer Nate Pincus, and passed the gavel to President Sarles.

Afrer general remarks by the new President, and some general discussion, the meeting was adjourned until the convention in the year 2000.

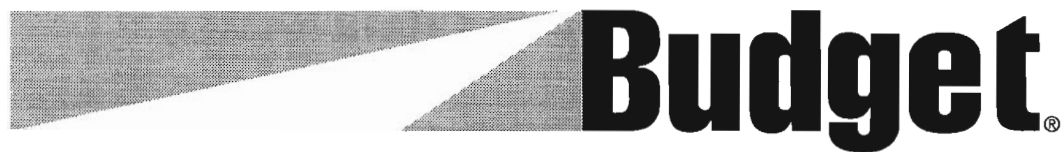
## **EXHIBITS**

*A Quick Survey of new donations to our Club Library*

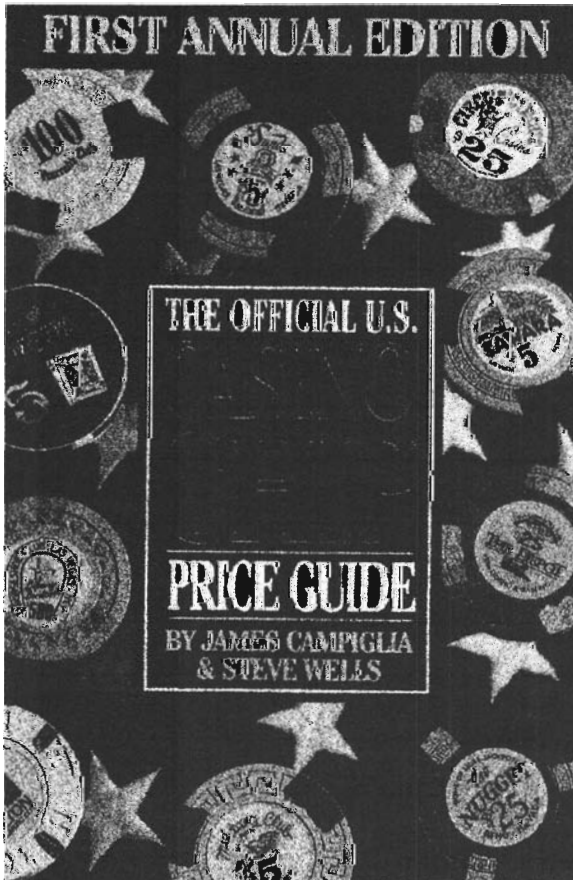

We also continue to receive monthly update copies of the new releases for Nevada chips, according to Nevada Gaming Control. And also, the library receives the monthly magazine from the ANA, titled "The Numismatist". From its beginning just over a year ago, the club library is building a nice selection of reference books and magazines, thanks to member donations.

## Featured New Books

This month, 2 books are featured with illustrations below. **The Official U.S. Casino Chip Price Guide**, by Campiglia & Wells, was donated to the club by the co-authors. Covering many chip issues from Nevada, Atlantic City and Deadwood (excluding recent Limited Edition releases), this full-color book is a delight to look at. Lots of historical information, including order of issues, price guides and some interesting older photos of casino postcards. The authors' grading system has stirred some discussion,

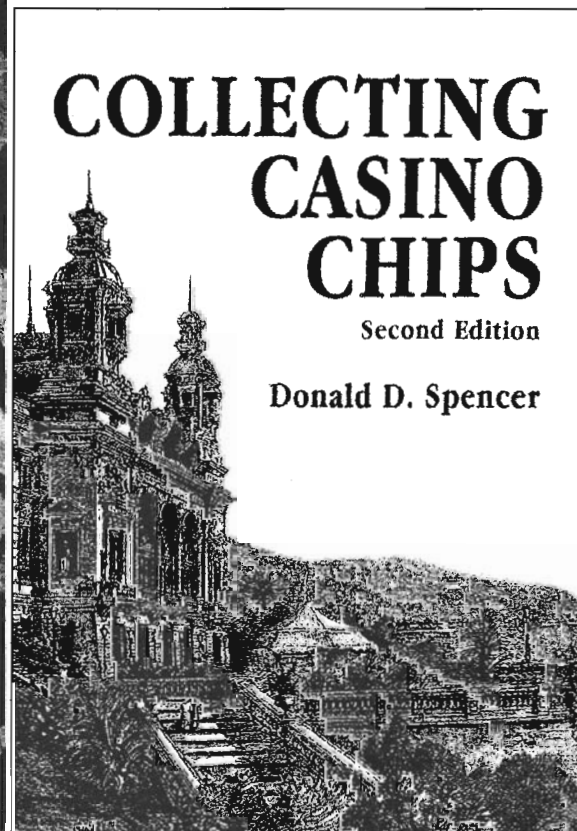

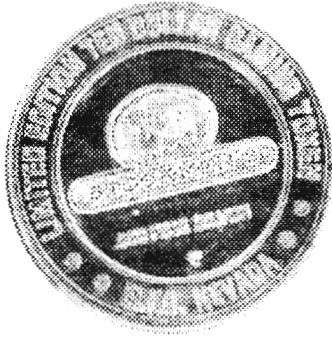

Northern Nevada finally took a turn a putting out new designs. The Stockman's in Elko is just adding the ".999" to the center silver but the others have noticeable changes.



Boomtown in Verdi, changed their logo but maintained the boot obverse.



The Atlantis in Reno not only did some fancy artwork to show their flaming tower located over Virginia St., but also put into play special machine located on the skyway over Virginia to dispense these special tokens.



The Peppermill issued the Slot August Night Strike with the "I" in "limited" in it's proper place. They are not found in the other machines.



The Sundowner kicked off the millennium by bringing out five new designs, all having to do with the year 2000. There are several casinos planning to utilize that theme.



Of course, let's make note that the Silver Legacy brought out their 4th anniversary strike/

At this writing, the three approved silver strikes for the Reno Hilton will be on the shelf for awhile since the casino has 7000 of the old one to move out the door

before they introduce the new line. A vault full of strikes at the Stateline Casino in Wendover has brought back one of the machines. Sorry, the race car series introduced just before the machines were pulled are all gone and have been added to the RARE category.

On the gloomy side, the Stardust called it quits as did the Riveria. A new casino was added to the chase for those seeking all - an Indian casino, Camel Rock, in Sante Fe, New Mexico.

Looking ahead, the Sparks Nugget is retiring the elephant and will have a new design. Bill's south Lake Tahoe, will soon add the .999 to the reverse. San Remo, Las Vegas, has a great "rolling into the millennium" strike and the Imperial Palace will offer a "millennium" \$200 strike.

Well, with the closing of the GDC (Green Duck Corporation) mint, a new situation has developed. The dies used to make the strikes are owned by Anchor Gaming. They will take the dies at GDC at Global and Sunshine to fill the next orders by the various casinos. If the strikes can be minted without Nevada Gaming Commission approval and there is no substantial charge in art work, it will be up to the collectors to discover when the new mint marks come out. In the north, Harrah's and the Eldorado will go to "G" and Cactus Pete's will go to the "S" mint.

After a certain number of strikes are minted, dies wear out and are recut. Hence, the creation of the varieties found in several strikes without showing up on the Gaming Control Board approval list...

If you feel the need to stay more current with the silver strike hobby, consider joining the Silver Strike's Chapter of CC&GTCC. They have a newsletter every other month devoted to this hobby. The dues are only \$10 a year and that's cheap to be in the know. Applications are available from my address.

# ATLANTIC CITY

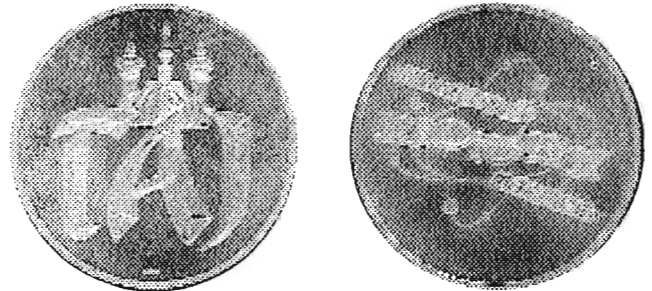

It would appear that I've got a mixed bag to report on A.C. new issues since my last report. Two fifty cent slot tokens have been introduced in town. Long a source for collectors of 40% silver half dollars and an occasional 90% silver half would be found in rolls and dispensed in payout trays of Atlantic City casinos. No more at Claridge and Trump Marina since June of this year! They both have issued their own .50¢ tokens and their slot machines will no longer accept Uncle Sam's half dollar. I guess it makes sense and is much cheaper to use your own token which costs only cents to produce rather than to stock hundreds of thousands of dollars of "real money" into the hundreds of coin hoppers that are sitting on the casino floor waiting to pay out that big jackpot!



At the east end of the boardwalk Down that west end of the boardwalk, (yes, A.C. is an

island that most people don't realize faces south) Trump Taj Mahal set up a promotional device call the Millennium Money Machine for its drive-in customers only. Hand your slot card to the attendant at the podium who scanned it through her computer which then allowed the player to insert the card into the millennium machine. IF you were selected a winner, a sealed flip top can was dispensed that contained a certificate for cash, or two free show tickets, or two complimentary buffets at the high roller Bengal Club, a tee shirt or cap, OR this neat though to get medallion illustrated below.



Meanwhile, at the west end of the famous walk, under a huge tent at Tropicana, sits a piece of the rusted hull of the ill-fated Titanic that has been raised from the depths of the magnificent ship's watery grave. Inside the casino is a large impressive exhibition of artifacts retrieved from the sunken wreck. The Titanic exhibit has been on display all summer long (for a steep admission fee of something like \$14) but which has been dismantled in early September and is no longer there. However, the \$10 commemorative chips are still there on the Big Six wheel if anyone wished to purchase an

inexpensive souvenir. I didn't see too many souvenirs priced under \$10 in the Titanic gift shop as one exited the huge exhibition hall....and this one can be redeemed at full value after one tires of it! What a great hobby!

Claridge has become Atlantic City's most prolific chip issuer... and the toughest place to get new issues. On Labor Day, like July 4th, the new 1999 king of A.C. commemoratives issued a solo \$5 chip for Labor Day.



In the middle of the famous Boardwalk sits the smallest A.C. casino of them all....Claridge. This tiny property was the only casino in town to mark this year's 4th of July holiday with a patriotic flag on a \$5 and a \$10 chip issue. While the \$5 chip survived the usual onslaught of chippers on the day of release and some chips were even left over the following day for latecomers.... the \$10 chip of the same issue didn't fare so well. With a total number of only five hundred \$10 chips issued, it instantly became one of Atlantic City's scarcest chips. The after market price on this chip is presently pegged at more than \$50... and is steadily going up, up, up.

Across town, in the Marina District far removed from the Boardwalk, lies Trump Marina. This property was once being considered as a future site for an Atlantic City Hard Rock Casino Hotel. However, the deal between hard Rock and The Donald didn't materialize.... but a popular Vegas Hard Rock Hotel chip promotion concept has been adopted by the Donald with his most recent "Rock The Dock" series of popular rock group commemorative chips being issued. Groups like Hootie & The Blowfish, Bid Bad Voodoo Daddy, Bad Company, and I hear a Blondie chip is presently in the works.





More recently, we are now into the midst of the annual Miss America preliminaries pageant and the chips associated with this event. Caesars issued a \$5 chip on the same day that 14,000 members of Local 54 of the Hotel & Restaurant Union went out on strike against the city's 12 casinos. The following day, Hurricane Floyd blew into town and chased the pickets away, and Sands issued it's \$10 version of the Miss America chip. Later that same day, Trump Marina issued their Miss A. \$5 chip. The following day, little Claridge repeated it's 4th of July trick and issued both a \$5 and \$10 Miss America chip. As of this writing, Trump Plaza has not released their Miss America chip yet due to some problem with their imaging test with the eye in the sky camera.

Couples with all the above activity, Trump Marina has replaced all their roulettes with a very attractive series of seashore themes, such as a Lighthouse, Sailboat, Anchor, Shell, Seahorse, Turtle, Lobster and an Angel Fish that are creating quite a stir among roulette collectors and converting many regular chip collectors into roulette "harvesters". Across the street, at Harrah's, the well used, worn out nautical CHIPCO roulette designs have been replaced with a whole new rack of same design roulettes, but different colors. These too have proven very popular with collectors.... especially for those who have everything else and are looking for new things to add to their chip collections. These roulettes have been a boon to chip traders as no one can get all the different roulette design and color combinations available by themselves. It has become truly a "team" effort to put together complete sets.





Well, that's it for another quarter gang. "See" you all in three more months with another update. Enjoying my "retirement" here on the Joisey Shore!

# THE RATIONALE TO INCLUDE A 'MOLD' REFERENCE TO AID IN IDENTIFYING CASINO CHIPS

The mold or the manufacturers' design is usually visible on the outer rim of a casino chip. This 'mold' can have the casino's name inscribed around the rim as is frequently seen in Atlantic City chips, e.g., Resorts International (figure 1) and on the Dunes Casino chips in Las Vegas, Nevada (figure 2). Other mold designs have a Hat & Cane, Horse Heads Left, Horseshoe, 'H', Dice and Suits or Diamond shapes etc. indented into the mold. The Bud Jones Co. of Las Vegas has adopted variations of colors and shapes in their outer rim of casino chips to identify specific chips. All these variations of molds can help identify the year or era of manufacture of a specific chip.

I decided to use the manufactures' MOLD in the descriptive portion of the identification system in order to help facilitate communication with fellow collectors. You may wish to adopt a similar system. Please remember that the key in collecting is to correctly identify a specific chip!

This system was *first* utilized by me in 1998 \*\* and has been invaluable to collectors in aiding the identification of casino chips. In the **Dutch Caribbean**, and many casinos in Nevada, a single casino may have used several different manufacturers' chips at different times or even have in play several varieties concurrently!

The system that was used in the **DUTCH CARIBBEAN** book is described briefly as follows:

KIN	25	H&C	.1
CASINO NAME	DENOMINATION	MOLD	# IN SERIES
KING INTERANTIONAL CASINO	25 DOLLARS	HAT & CANE	(SAME MOLD)



If one has established the casino name, and the denomination, then the mold description will help to identify the chip.

An example is the King Casino of Aruba. Over the years, they issued seven different \$25.00 dollar chips ranging from Ewing's alternating suits to Paul-son's Hat & Cane, to Bud Jones Metal center inlays. Even with the same manufacturer there are variations in chips; these include but are not limited to different numbers and color of *inserts*, to bacarrat or non-bacarrat chips, or 'credit' chips, or color variations. The color variations are usually due to non-standardized manufacturing 'runs' of the chips. Similarly, at different ordering times a decision may be made by the casino or the manufacturer to change the center inlay design or that a complaint was made as to fading colors of the graphics. This example is clearly noticed in the Divi-Divi tree logo of the King Casino in ALL denominations, the \$1.00, \$5.00, 25.00 and \$100.00 chips. The first issue, KIN – 25 E .1, has a lighter Divi-Divi tree (figure 3), while the second issue of the \$25.00 chip, KIN – 25 E .2, (figure 4) is a lighter green chip with a darker, more pronounced Divi-Divi tree.

The center inlay can further identify chips, for example, the KIN – 25 H&C .1 is a Hat & Cane mold with a Cog Wheel center inlay design (figure 5 ) while the KIN – 25 H&C .2 (figure 6 ) is also a Hat & Cane mold with a Scalloped center inlay.

If one considers the **Horseshoe Casino** in downtown Las Vegas, and if you collect .25 cent chips, one must be cognizant of the different molds because there are rare chips that may be confused with more common chips.

'N' Refers to The Chip Rack identification number.

HSE Refers to the Horseshoe Casino in Las Vegas, Nevada.

For brevity, below are only a few examples of the many mold designs:

H = House name

LGK = Large Greek Key manufactured by the B.C. Wills Co.

HHL = Horse Head Left manufactured by the Langworthy Co., 16 repetitions of horses heads

DIS = Di Swirl currently manufactured by Mid West Gaming Supply

ARO = Arodie, 12 repetitions of Arrows & Dice

H&C = Hat & Cane mold manufactured by the Paul-son Co.

HSE = Horseshoe mold manufactured by the T K Specialty Co., 16 repetitions of horseshoes alternating inward and outward

E = Ewing Manufacturing Co., alternating dice after every other pair of suits

BJ = The Bud Jones Co.

The following are eight examples of the sixteen 25 cent Horseshoe chips listed in The Chip Rack:

1. N 1764 = 25 cent B.C. Wills Large Key *red* chip = HSE - .25 LGK .1
2. N 4272 = 25 cent Horse Head Left *red* chip = HSE - .25 HHL .1
3. N 1775 = 25 cent Dieswirl *red* chip = HSE - .25 DIS .1
4. N 9971 = 25 cent ARODIE red chip = HSE - .25 ARO .1
5. N 7151 = 25 cent ARODIE *red* chip = HSE - .25 ARO .2

The .25 cent Arrowdie chip with the building logo , .25 ARO. 1, (figure 10) is a very rare chip valued about \$900.00. The Arodie chip without the building, .25 ARO.2, (figure 11) while rare, with a similar round, white inlay has a value approximately 20 percent of the \$900.00 at \$150.00.

All of the above chips are RED or variations of red, yet have different collector values and different rarities! The use of the *prefix* identifies the casino while the use of the *suffix* describes the *mold* and easily aids in the recognition and identification of these chips.

The following *brown* colored chips can also be easily misinterpreted:

6. N 1773 = 25 cent HAT & CANE mold *brown* chip = HSE - .25 H&C .1
7. N 1774 = 25 cent Horseshoe mold *brown* chip = HSE - .25 HSE .1
8. N 1767 = 25 cent Horseshoe mold brown chip = HSE - .25 HSE .2

The decimal point ‘.’ refers to the same chip with the *same* mold in a *series* but varies in color of the center inlay or number of inserts, etc. In the above example, N 1774 the ‘.1’ identifies a chip which has a *hot stamp* without a center inlay ( figure #13) while N 1767 the ‘.2’ identifies the same chip but with a round white center inlay chip. The two *brown* chips with gold hot stamps (figures # 12 & 13) are valued from \$5.00 to \$14.00 each, a far cry from \$150.00 to \$900.00 per chip of the rarer Arodie chips! All of the above chips were used in the same casino.

The above system is simple and easy to use. However, if one wanted to include *more* information such as a center inlay, hot stamp or inserts, then additional suffixes need to be developed. For example, *HSE - .25 HSE .1 CI* (Center Inlay) for chip N 1767, and *HSE – .25 HSE .2 HS* (Hot Stamp) for chip #13.

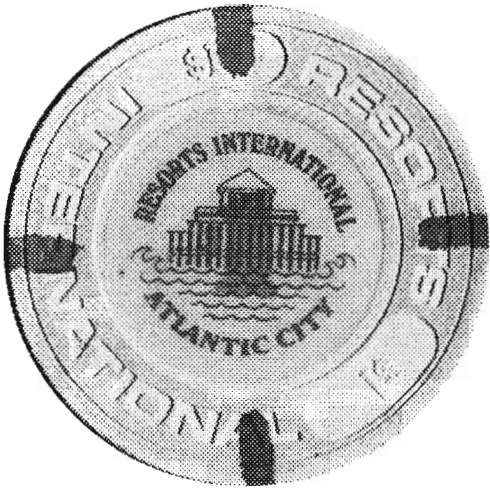
In the July 1999 issue of Chip Chat published by Doug Saito, he states, “The toughest lesson for beginning collectors to learn is always to “read” or look at a chip from the outside in – look at the rim edge first, then its center. The mold design should always be given first mention. Then you’ll begin to learn why a manufacture’s mold design separates rare chips from commons, old chips from new, great chips from so-so’s.” This Chip Chat magazine is published approximately six times a year and has a wealth of historical information to aid the collector in understanding the hobby of chip collecting.

In the 6<sup>th</sup> edition (1999) of *The Chip Rack* by Knapp, & Myers & Wheelden, for the *first* time they devoted a chapter on “Chip Rack Molds cross referenced to casino name”. This further emphasizes the need for using a mold to help identify a specific casino chip. Please realize that in Bill Borland’s 1988 *World Wide Casino Chip Blue Book*, he always described a chip with the mold.

In the 1998 edition of the *The Gaming Table* by Myers, Wheelden & Knapp, the authors illustrate in great detail ‘Mold Codes’ and ‘Mold Code Graphics’ to aid in the identification of casino chips.

Therefore if one wants to easily communicate with fellow collectors, one must be able to identify a specific chip and with the knowledge of the chip’s mold, this task is more readily achieved. Happy Chipping!

## **A Committee on Archives, Standards and Publishing for CC&GTCC** by Howard W. Herz (CH-85-3)

It was almost 15 year ago when I first faced the problem of defining some standards for describing the gaming tokens and gaming checks in Harvey's collection. It was an effort that was for a private collection (Harvey's) and was not intended as a public project. That effort did evolve into Harvey's Guide to Collecting and was probably the first attempt to bring some organized structure to the description of gaming checks.

In a parallel effort, Dale Seymour published his pioneering book on the generic poker chips and ivory checks. Dale's effort was a magnificent publication that brought order and a reasonable sense of understanding to a very complicated field of collecting. Dale's effort was public in the sense that it was published for collectors around the world.

Since Harvey's Guide and Seymour's pioneering work, Knapp, Myers and Wheelden's Chip Rack and Gaming Table have gone far beyond the first research into chips and checks. Today a far larger number of people are researching the history of these gaming artifacts. Perhaps it is time for the CC&GTCC to provide a framework that can recognize some of the basic definitions and discoveries that historical research has unearthed as well as defining some common language for collectors.

Archie Black appointed a committee to research a common numbering system for chips and checks. Although the committee has probably found that its objective is far more complex than originally imagined, it has made progress that indicates that a common system of numbering might be found.

When very general information is gathered for the common understanding of the membership, I tend to think in terms of it being preserved by an entity with common purpose and thus I am suggesting a CC&GTCC committee on Archives and Standards.

Archives and Standards suggests that some of the information that we learn about our hobby should be preserved and be made available for the membership. I recently accepted the position of Historian for CC&GTCC. It was a position that I briefly held at the inception of the club. Janice O'Neal has functioned as historian for most of the life of the club and her determination and attention should be applauded by everyone. I would suggest that it is time that our governing board consider a committee that will specifically be in charge of defining and preserving all of the common knowledge that our hobby has acquired since the inception of the club. This would preserve and provide our membership with a standard framework of information about chips, checks and gaming tokens and establish standards for descriptions.

We are certainly in possession of a far greater body of information today than when Dale and I first began to catalog and describe chips and checks. If think that most of the information, historical and factual has been found - think again. We are just scratching the surface of the rich and interesting history of gambling that the chips and checks, as artifacts of gaming, represent.

I also believe that information and research are some of the keys to the enjoyment of our hobby. The economics of publishing and the reality of extensive research costs frequently prevent the dissemination of information. I would suggest that the CC&GTCC consider the publication of information about areas of our hobby that are too extensive for the pages of our quarterly magazine, but too exclusive in scope to meet the economics of private publishing. Perhaps the club can look at the concept of providing the publication of some specific areas of research for the collector.

I believe that the membership should determine with its comments the fate of the above suggestions. I am convinced authors such as Archie Black, Ralph Pollack, Greg Susong, Mark and Myrna Lighterman, Robert Ginsburg, James Campiglia and Steve Wells will continue, along with many others to enlighten and enhance our hobby with private books. Perhaps the CC&GTCC can help to stimulate and encourage this trend.

If this presents an agreeable objective for some of this club's activities, lets hear from the membership.

From the graphics on the preceding pages, you can see how observing chip box labels can bring up lots of interesting questions. Who were the manufacturers? Who were the distributors? Did manufacturers distribute their own products? Who manufactured a given design?

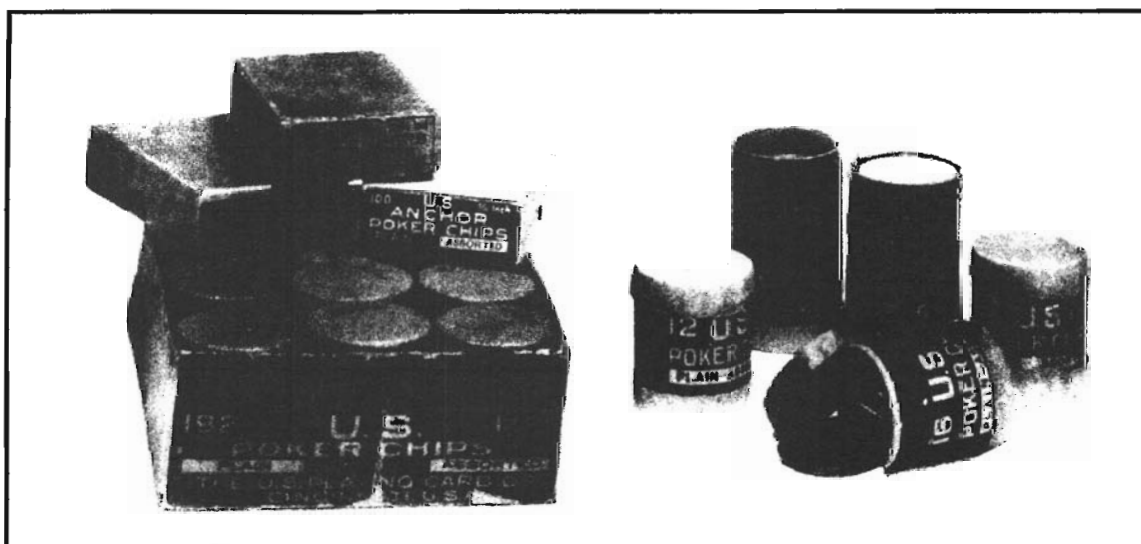
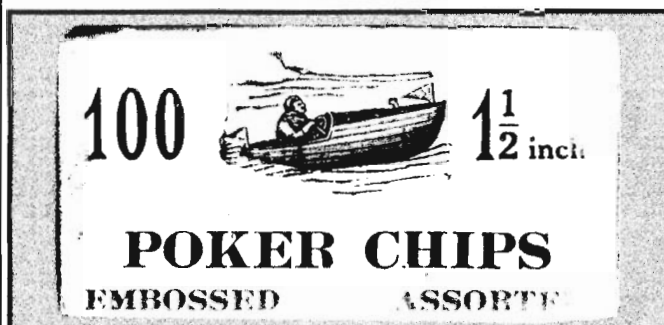
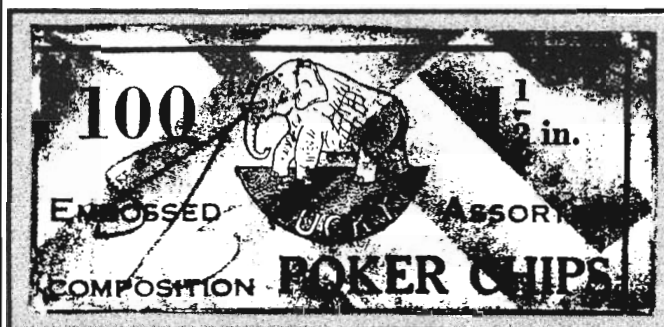
For the most part, in the first half of the 20th century, poker chips made for purchase and use by the public did not have identifiable borders like chips made in that era for private clubs or special order customers. For obvious reasons, chips designed for clubs and custom-designed chips for private individuals were made to be unique. This was not true of all chips designed for home games. If one company had an eagle chip, competitive chip makers made their eagle chip. Often the copied chip was almost identical. Old gambling catalogs and chip box labels help collectors to identify the makers of certain chip designs and variations.

The U.S. Playing Card Co. in Cincinnati, Ohio was by far the largest manufacturer of poker chips in America between 1890 and 1940. What we collectors are trying to sort out is --- Which other companies that sold chips, actually manufactured their own chips? and Did the US Playing Card Co. custom-design chips for other major chip distributors?

Company identification did not always appear on the box end label. It might be on the side or top of the box. Chip boxes in our collections not pictured on the previous pages identify such companies as: Noll, Inc., Pasadena, CA; AP Games; Dyment Co., Cleveland; Pioneer Co., Cincinnati; Pattberg Novelty Co., New York; Walgreen Drug; Square Chip, Inc., Dallas; Victory Mfg. Corp., Chicago; and Van Dyke Products, Milwaukee.

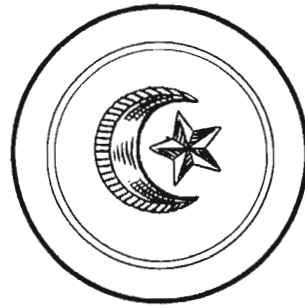

Cylindrical and miniature chip containers from the U.S. Playing Card Company.

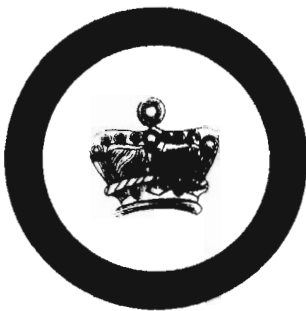

# PHIL'S FORAYS LEAVING LAS VEGAS

Living in Southern Nevada in the early '70's was fun but it was difficult to pursue my passion for small town gaming chips. Unlike the Northern part of the state with its well established history of gambling in the hinterlands, Clark County was practically barren of any live gaming outside of the Las Vegas valley.

I made my first trip to Pahrump in the summer of 1970, which was seven years after electricity and three years before the Saddle West which was Pahrump's first full-bore casino. The only bar in town was a place called Joe's Cotton Picken' Saloon which by the way is still in business and looks much the same now as it did then, however the name changed to the Waterhole. It's also been known as the Eight Ball Lounge and BJ's which had a 21 game at one time. After the long trip from Vegas I was anxious to go inside and have a cold one. I was disappointed that there wasn't any gambling there but passed the time talking to the bartender-who could have been Joe himself-and he told me that the bar came out of an old saloon in Virginia City. I thought that was interesting as I had spent some time in the bars there when I lived in Reno. Anyway, I asked him if there were any other places around and he directed me to a place called Fred's Bar located a few miles down the road on the way to Death Valley.

I finished my beer and headed out in search of the place. It wasn't hard to find as Pahrump in those days was mostly desert and critters. I pulled up to the bar and as I got out of the truck I came within inches of stepping on a very large snake who had been sunning himself in my parking space. I don't know who was more startled but we both took off in opposite directions-me into the bar yelling "SNAKES!" or something to that effect. The bartender-who could have been Fred-thought it was real funny. Anyway, we talked for a while and I put a few nickels in the two or three antique slot machines that stood along the wall. I was disappointed that there was no 21 game but didn't really expect to find one. As it turned out it would be my only visit to Fred's Bar as it burned down sometime after that. You can still see the ruins if you know where to look.

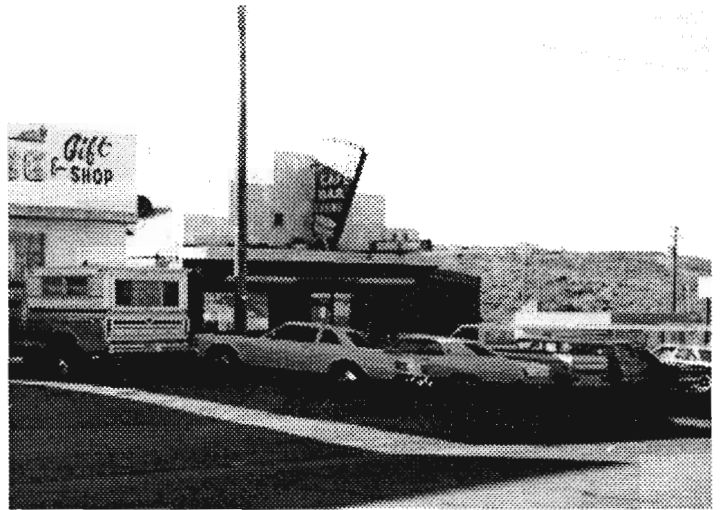
Leaving Fred's I took off into the desert on a dirt road that went through the Ash Meadows Wildlife Area. I had heard there was some neat stuff out there and wanted to check it out-besides, I still hadn't located any chips and was getting a little frustrated.

It wasn't long until I ran across a bar with an attached runway, swimming pool, and cathouse. It was pretty nice actually with quite a few slot machines but no live gaming. After a beer or two I continued my journey through the outback of the Amargosa desert. Shortly I came across Devil's Hole, home of the endangered Pupfish and former stomping ground of Charles Manson. Curious, I climbed down into the hole and watched the little Pupfish swim around. Today, the place is surrounded by a chin-link fence and impossible to enter.

Continuing on, I finally reached the paved hiway leading to California and eventually discovered the Stateline Saloon. Much to my delight, there was a 21 and poker table although neither looked like they had been used for some time. Luckily the

owner, a lady by the name of Doris Jackson, who by the way still owns the place today took me in the office and sold me some of her chips. After a long, dry trip I had finally hit pay dirt-wa-la. Happily I headed back to Las Vegas but would return whenever I could to the Stateline Saloon, the crown jewel of the Amargosa.

Heading south from Las Vegas were a couple of places I could scrounge for chips. The first was Searchlight and there was a neat old place there called Sandy's. It was originally owned by a Sandy Sandquist and the chips which bore his name were still in use. By now though, Warren Doing owned the joint and he was quite a character. One could usually find him wearing a red baseball cap and yuking it up with the old timers who hung out in the place. Once in a while the boys would get up a poker game with some old Boulder Club chips from Vegas. They were the small crown red ones with an insert showing the old sign. One day I was able to talk old Warren out of one and I was real proud of it.



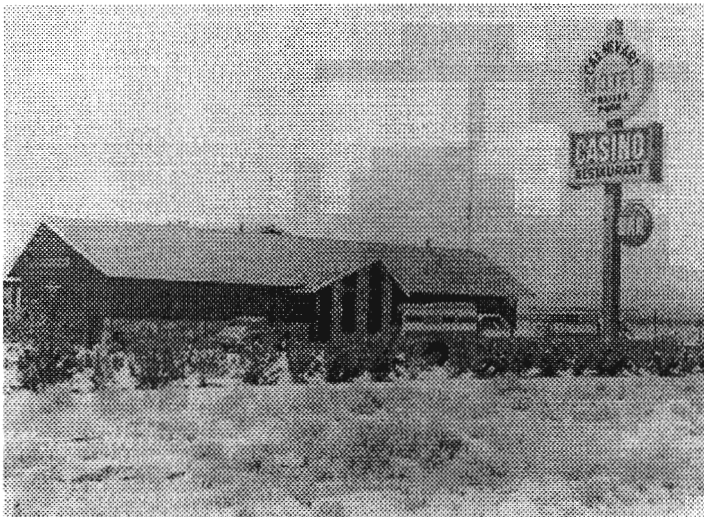
Sandy's Club in Searchlight probably early '70's. The building still stands.

Next door was a place called the El Ray Club. It wasn't the original one owned by Willie Martello which had been across the street but a second version which had one 21 table and about four slots. They used a yellow \$5 chip from the Last Frontier in Vegas-the one with the dancing girl on it. It was one of my favorites and I managed to rathole a couple extra. Still, I wished they had used something with the town name.

Another place called the Chevron Bar was located at the opposite end of town and was connected to a Chevron Gas Station. Unfortunately, it had closed in 1969 so I just missed it. I was able to locate the owner and he gave me a couple of the chips. I was disappointed that they didn't say Searchlight on them but was glad to get them just the same. You can still see inside the place with its rather ornate ceiling.

A few miles down the road was the Cal-Nev-Ari Casino and landing strip. It opened in 1967 and was owned by Slim Kidwell and his wife, Nancy. Slim was an old time pioneer aviator who also tended bar on occasion. I asked him why he built his place in the middle of nowhere. He told me one day he was flying around scouting for a site and had his plane on automatic pilot. He wound up falling asleep and when woke up he was just about out of gas. Fortunately, he was able to land ok and when he got out of the plane declared the place Cal-Nev-Ari. Anyway, they had a crap and 21 game in there but rarely opened them due

to a scarcity of dealers in the area. I was able to buy the chips, the one with the Horsehead mold.

Leaving the main hiway, the road to Laughlin snaked over the mountains down to Davis Dam and the Colorado River. From there a narrow road followed the river into Laughlin itself here there were three casinos- The Riverside, Monte Carlo and Odie Lopp's Nevada Club.

The Riverside was a small, cramped place with 4 or 5 twenty-one tables and a crap game that was so close to the wall you could hardly get by it to use the restroom. The Post Office was also located there using the name Laughlin. It's interesting to note that the dollar token in play had the location as Davis Dam, Nevada and the name Southpoint was used by the government. Anyway, for it's first few years of existence there was some confusion as to what the name really was but Laughlin won out in the end. Anyway I rounded up the available chips and headed down the road.

Down the road on the other side was the Monte Carlo Resort. I believe it was a little larger than the Riverside and I remember it being rather cool and dark inside-a nice respite from the summer sun. The bar ran the length of two of the walls so the bartender was kept on the run. There were probably 4 or 5 twenty-one tables and a crap and poker game. There was never much business as hardly anyone went to Laughlin in those days. I bought in on the 21 game and began looking through the chips which turned out to be all in good shape since the place had only been open about a year. I was delighted that they used a dove tail 50¢ chip even though it didn't have the town name on it-just Monte Carlo. I was only able to get a few and discovered that there were actually two varieties-I was really on a roll! Anyway

the place lasted until 1977 and was at a disadvantage because it was away from the river. It was re-named the Crystal Palace and that lasted until about 1985 when it closed. I believe the building was used by the Chamber of Commerce for a while and it still stands today.

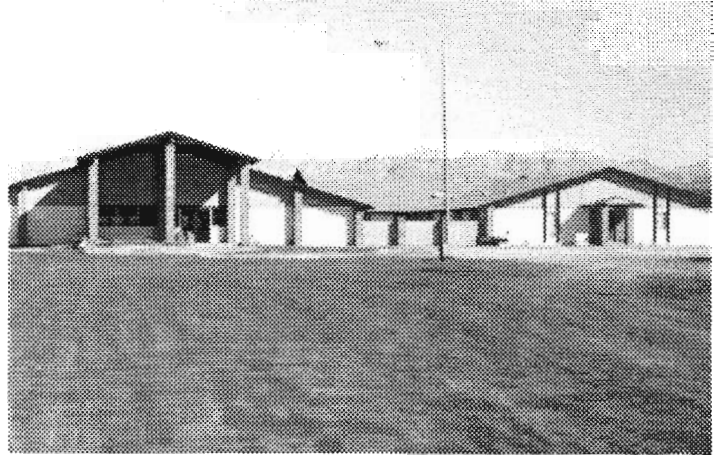
Leaving the Monte Carlo there was a fork in the road. If you went right you were on your way to Needles-if you went left it took you down to the river and Odie Lopp's Nevada Club. It was previously the Bobcat Club which supposedly had live gaming a couple of years earlier but I was never able to locate any chips from there. Anyway, you couldn't see it from the road because the sagebrush and blocked the view and I think there was a small sign directing one to the casino. There was also a row of trees in front of the place which was the only shade in town. If I stayed overnight I would park under them to escape the morning sun.

The chips were kind of neat having Odie's name on them and some of the five dollar denominations had the name Southpoint. The place went through a series of owners after Lopp sold out around 1975 and today the place is the Golden Nugget. Amazingly, the pit area is much the same today as it was in 1970!

The eighties saw phenomenal growth as Laughlin blossomed into a mini-Las Vegas complete with biker rallies and rodeos. I still go down to goof off and collect a few of the chips and tokens that are issued these days but I still have fond memories of when Laughlin was young thirty years ago.

The last holdout for chips in Clark County was Mesquite, a sleepy community eighty miles east of Las Vegas. Unfortunately, there was only one place with live gaming and that was George Harmon's Valley Inn. It was a dusty old joint with only one twenty one game and some old slot machines. Getting the chips was a real challenge since the game was hardly ever open. It took several trips before I was able to get the one and five dollar diamond molds that were in use and later a plain black 50¢ chip on the NEVADA mold. After George died around 1975 the new owners pasted stickers on the chip to coverup the Harmon name. I thought it was pretty tacky. In recent years the place was demolished and replaced with the Golden West Casino.

The present-day Oasis was called Western Village in those days but had no live gaming. It was mostly a restaurant serving travellers on their way through town and had a long row of slot machines overlooking the street. Eventually a 21 table was added and bit by bit the place grew into the resort it is today.

There were two other bars in town, the Corner which is still in operation, and a neat old place called the Blue Spot which looked like a house with a screen porch. It was located roughly across the street from the present-day Stateline Casino.

Anyway, I made a lot of dry runs to the outlying areas of Las Vegas but even if I didn't come up with any chips I always had a good time-I'll always remember them.

# THE INFORMATION BOOTH

Welcome to another installment of “The Information Booth.” For those of you who are reading the column for the first time, I try to provide some information about unidentified flying chips (UFC’s) submitted by members for identification, and to answer questions about casino history, chip history, or related subjects.

As I always do, I’ll begin with some answers to previous UFC questions. Also, I repeat my request for participation by club members. This column is only of value if you take time to write to me with identifications of chips you recognize here in the column, and if you send *legible* photocopies (full size is a must; black and white is preferred, and please *do not send enlarged copies or color copies*) or samples of chips you’d like identified. Please don’t assume that if you recognize a chip, someone else will. Don’t assume that “everyone knows what that chip is.” If you have information which may be of help to other members, please share it through this column.

There are always far more unidentified chips than there are members who write to me with answers. The purpose of this column is to try to identify chips that our members ask about. It’s important to share your knowledge of chips that your fellow members may not know about. Come on, collectors: help!

You will notice that very few of the chips which appear in the column are simply photocopied. That’s because many older chips do not have enough contrast to photocopy well, and if they will not photocopy once, they certainly will not photocopy a second time when the magazine is published. As a result, I hand-illustrate most of the chips pictured here. It’s a painstaking process, because I make every effort to make sure that each chip illustration is as close as possible to its original version. That way, recognition and identification may be possible.

Please follow the following simple rules when submitting chips or copies for inclusion in “The Information Booth”:

☞ If you have a chip that will not photocopy well,

please send it, packed carefully. *If you’d like me to return it, please enclose return postage.*

☞ Black and white photocopies only, please! Believe it or not, it’s actually more difficult to work with color photocopies than with black and white, even though they look prettier when you copy them!

☞ No electronic scans, please! Scans are virtually impossible to work with, because they’re almost never actual size. If you have a scanner, I know you like to show off the results, and electronic transmission is certainly faster and easier than (gasp!) taking pen in hand and writing a note, but please, *if you want your UFC to appear in this column, don’t send me scans!*

☞ Legibility is the key: *Please realize that if you cannot read what is printed on a chip clearly after you photocopy it for the column, neither can I, and illustrating it will be impossible.* In such a case, you may send the chip to me, *with return postage* if you would like the chip sent back to you.

Also, please realize that if you recognize a chip published here as a UFC, you have information that your fellow collectors do not have. Please share. That’s the whole point of this column. What is common knowledge in one area of collecting is completely unknown in others. For those of you with answers or questions, please share your information by writing to me at P. O. Box 340345, Columbus, Ohio 43234.

This issue’s column is chock full of great information, and a tip of the Information Booth hat goes to those members who took time to send us the details about the chips they’d seen here. Typically, there are more questions than answers in the column, but that’s to be expected!

As usual, we’ll begin with some identifications of previously-published UFC’s. The volume and issue number of the magazine where the chip first appeared is shown in parentheses so you can see the illustration if you wish.

**UFC 212 (4/1):** Here's one that's been unidentified for quite a long time! Thanks to Russ McDermott's information about illegal clubs in the Ft. Worth, TX area, we may have an identification. It seems likely that this chip, which bears only the number **3939**, was used at the 3939 Club on Jacksboro Hwy., Ft. Worth. Interestingly, Russ tells us that one of the owners of the 3939 Club was Phil Long. Sound familiar? It should: he owned the California Club in downtown Las Vegas for some years.

**UFC 505 (5/4):** **Chez Paree** was identified many moons ago—or at least so we thought! Seems that we were close, but not quite right with the location. **Chez Paree** was an illegal club in Carter Lake, NE. I'd originally identified it as Carter Lake, IA. According to *The Players: The Men Who Made Las Vegas* (1997), Jack Sheehan, ed., the club was run by the uncle of Las Vegas gaming pioneer Jackie Gaughan.

**UFC 645-2 (7/2):** Jerry Birl, "Mr. Roulette," believes that the **Plantation** chip was likely used at the Plantation in Hallandale, FL. The old "C" mold (actually a C in the center of the chip, rather than around the edge) certainly fits with the Florida Gold Coast era.

**UFC 1168 (11/3):** Another identification from Jerry Birl: the initials **JP** in on the harp mold chip shown in this column was used by Jack Pincus at an illegal club in Hot Springs, AR.

**UFC 1187 (11/4):** Jim Myers brought this **BC** chip back from a trip to Alaska, and was told that it had been used in an illegal club in Anchorage. That might be true, but Rick Meyer tells us that he knows that it was used in the early 1970's at the **Boulevard Club** in San Diego. In fact, he tells us that it was the club's first issue. This may be one of those chips that found its way (or down) the Pacific Coast!

**UFC 1211 (11/4):** This chip, which bears the initials **LLC**, was used in the early 1970's (another first issue chip) at the **Lucky Lady Cardroom** in San Diego. The club's still open, and *The Gaming Table* also shows it in San Diego. It appears that the Livermore, CA attribution is wrong.

**UFC 1231 (12/1):** I mentioned that several members had pointed out that this chip, bearing the name **544 Club**, appeared in a montage of New Orleans area chips on the cover of a Gaming Times magazine issue. *Delta Nights: N.O.L.A.*, the new book by Finstuen,

Kleindeinst, Marshall and Marshall, indicates that the chip was used at an illegal club in the New Orleans French Quarter.

**UFC 1255 (12/3):** In the last issue, I illustrated a chip with the initials **MSC** (which might well be **MCS**; in a monogram, the larger center initial is usually last) alongside a photocopy of the same chip over stamped **S. S. Monte Carlo**, the gambling ship off the coast of California in the 1930's. Gene Trimble has tracked the chip down through Howard Herz's Mason Co. files, and has found some odd information he shares with us. It seems that the MSC chip was originally delivered to L. A. Miller at the **Muskogee Social Club** in Manhattan, NY.

That order consisted of a total of 1,000 chips in 1930, which as Gene points out, is certainly not enough for a casino, but would be enough for a private poker game. Interestingly, although four colors were sent to Miller, green was not among them.

To further confuse the issue, in 1938, 500 brown chips bearing the same hotstamp were delivered to Jake Katleman (a relative of Beldon Katleman, who owned El Rancho Vegas?) in Los Angeles. Still no green chips accounted for! And there doesn't seem to be a connection between Katelman in Los Angeles and Miller in New York City.

Gene says doubts any connection between the chips and the Monte Carlo gambling ship, partly because of the two different orders, but also because "the MSC would have to stand for 'Monte Ship Carlo.' Or maybe M.S. Carlo."

Maybe. But several other explanations are possible as well. Initials on chips are often initials of the owners or operators of clubs, rather than the names of the clubs themselves. Sometimes the initials are those of several people, not just one. And the connection between NY and CA? I'm certainly not suggesting that I know, but illegal club chips have been known to show up in places other than where they were originally shipped. Chips from Northern Kentucky, for example, were used in Florida clubs in the off-season and are now often found in Las Vegas; the Chesterfield Club chip from Detroit was used at the Nevada Lodge, Lake Tahoe, when Lincoln Fitzgerald first purchased the Nevada Lodge. Those chips bear the initials CC, which have no relationship to the initials of the Nevada Lodge or Lincoln Fitzgerald.

Sometimes the more we know, the more confused we get!

**UFC 1260 (12/3):** After seeing the **Log Cabin** chip in

last issue's column, Gene Trimble contacted T. R. King, which told him that they have no record of the chip. Gene says T. R. King has records back to 1936, so the chip could be earlier than that, or the record may have been lost. No one else has recognized the chip. *The Gaming Table* lists eleven different Log Cabin clubs, bars, or cardrooms, of which ten are possibilities for this chip.

**UFC 1261 (12/3):** This is a crest and seal chip, with beautiful lithograph inlays bearing the Mexican national symbols. They were delivered to a distributor in El Paso, TX in 1917, but we still have no firm information on where the chips were used or for whom they might have been made.

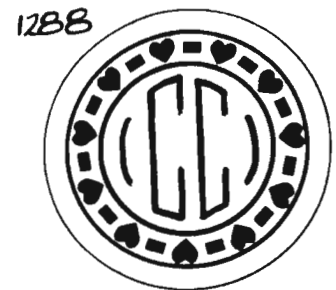
**UFC 1262 (12/3):** Here's another chip that may have been used in two different places. I'd originally purchased **The Club** chip from a woman in Alaska who specializes in collecting tokens (in the coin world, that term includes casino chips) from Alaska. Steve Goodrich, Mr. Pacific NW, wrote immediately to say that he had pretty solid evidence that the chip was used in a club in Libby, Montana. (One of the attributions in *The Gaming Table* as well.) I followed up with the lady I purchased the chip from, and she tells us that she obtained the chip from a long-time collector of Alaska material, and that there was little doubt in her mind that the chip was used at The Club in Anchorage (not Fairbanks, as indicated in last issue's column). She also referred me to a book published by TAMS (Token and Medal Society) entitled *Alaska Tokens*, written by someone named Benice in 1994, which confirms the use of the chip at The Club in Anchorage. She says that The Club had been open since 1936, and only recently closed.

Both identifications sound pretty authentic to me! This may be one of those chips that was shuffled back and forth between Alaska and the lower 48!

**UFC 1264 (12/3):** Gene Trimble passed on the information he obtained from T. R. King—the **United Cigar** chip wasn't an advertising chip, it was a California cardroom. The chips were delivered to J. B. Nicely in Delano, CA in 1945 and in 1947. Al Bernstein also says that there was a chain of United Cigar stores in the Chicago area, but apparently there's no relation.

Now for some new submissions! As usual, a small "\$" next to the chip illustration indicates that a

denomination appears on the reverse. If there is no such notation, or if both sides of a chip are not shown, the obverse and reverse are, so far as I know, identical.

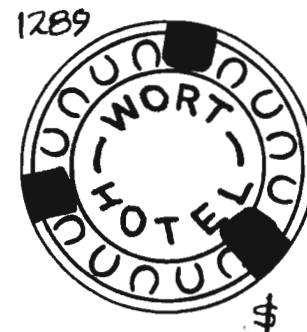


**UFC 1285:** According to *The Gaming Table*, this chip is from the **Shanty** Cardroom in Ukiah, CA. It's closed, but we're not sure of its dates of operation.

**UFC 1286:** The **Antler's Club** was a cardroom in Santa Cruz, CA, and *The Gaming Table* tells us that it was open from 1948-1969.

**UFC 1287:** **Vets Club** was an illegal casino in Toledo, OH.

**UFC 1288:** This CC chip is reportedly from Club C in Kemah, TX, near Galveston. Frank Chalfont's Galveston book shows a different type of CC chip with a hub rim. Can anyone confirm whether the chip shown here was in fact used at the Club C?



**UFC 1289:** *The Gaming Table* tells us that Jackson Hole, WY was the location of the **Wort Hotel**, which ran unlicensed games from early in the 1900's through the mid-1950's. I don't know whether these chips



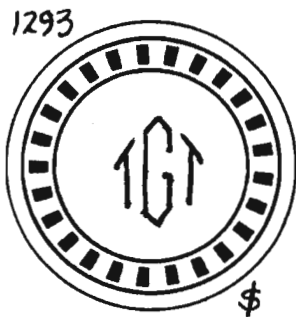
were used in a poker game or in more casino-type house-banked games.

**UFC 1290:** The **Vegas Club** was a cardroom in Chula Vista, CA, open from 1982-1997. The known chips from the Vegas Club, however, are hat and cane mold chips. Can someone tell us whether this chip is from the Chula Vista club or another location?

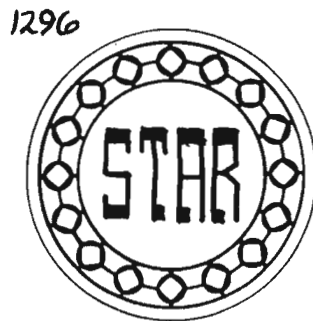


**UFC 1291:** Here's another possibility but no confirmation. There was an **Arcade** cardroom in San Diego from 1955-1959, but so far as we know, their chips were small crown T. R. King chips. Is this chip another from the San Diego club, or from another club?

**UFC 1292:** This L mold chip is identified. According to *The Gaming Table*, **Rick's Club** was located in Fargo, ND. We're not sure whether it's still open.



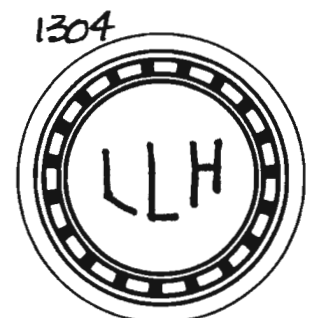
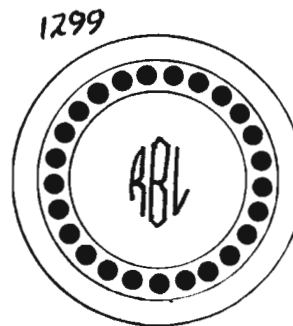
**UFC 1293 and UFC 1294:** There is no truth to the rumor that 1293 was made for the authors of *The Gaming Table*, nor was 1294 made for the high stakes poker game run by Ernie Wheelden. Does anyone recognize these chips?



**UFC 1295:** This monogrammed chip, made for someone whose initials are **M.S.R.**, appears to be made of an early acrylic or plastic. It's not a casino chip, but is an interesting poker chip.

**UFC 1296:** The reversed of this **Star** chip says **PAN**, indicating that it was used for that game. Pan is most often played in CA, and to a lesser degree in NV. Does anyone recognize the chip?

The remaining chips on this page and the next are more new UFC's for identification. Please let me know if any is familiar to you.

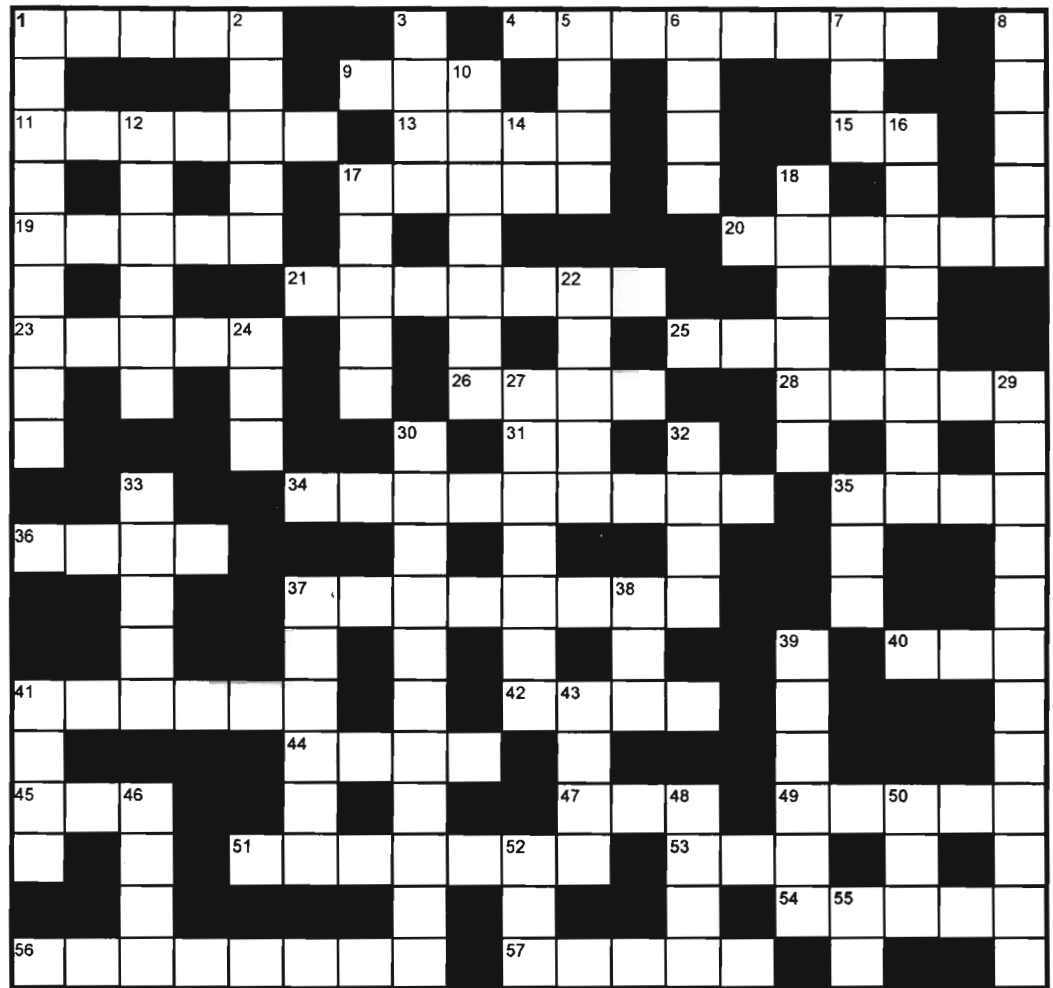

# B.P.O.E. LODGES

The following numerical list of Elk's lodges is not a project originated by the present authors. Acknowledgement is given to Duane Feisel who, in 1975, compiled a list of lodges which was published in *Trade Token Topics*. This list was arranged by the area in which the lodge was located, making the identification of maverick tokens a time consuming process.

Using Feisel's list as a base, a concerted effort was made to fill in the gaps. The omissions, and new lodges organized since 1975, were obtained from the records of the Elks National

Headquarters. We believe the present list to be complete and accurate. However, errors can and do occur. Anyone having corrections or additional data is urged to contact the authors.

We have made no attempt to identify those Elk lodges known to have issued tokens. The list is provided to enable collectors to identify the many maverick tokens issued by Elk lodges. The user will note an asterisk (\*) after some listings; this indicates that there are comments concerning that lodge in the "Notes" section following the numerical listing.

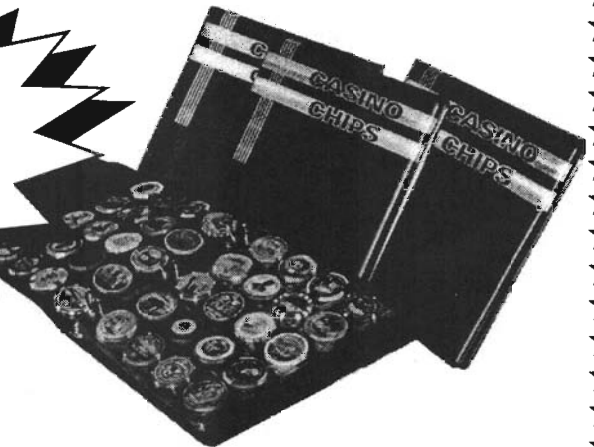

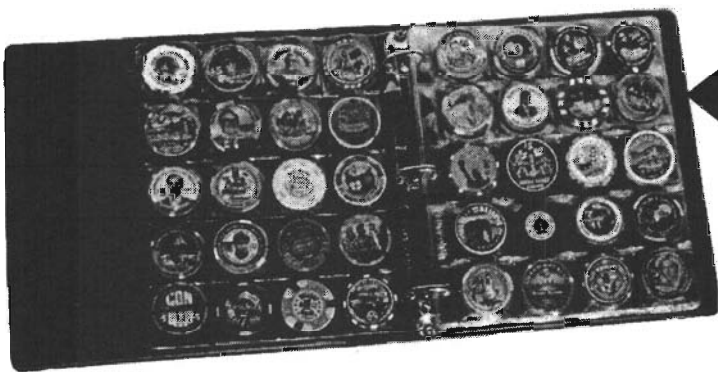

## **A Northern Nevada Car Trip,**

*by Al Rios, R-2160*

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to drive around Nevada and visit some of the small towns and casinos? Nor-Cal-Nev Chapter member Al Rios recently took a car trip from Reno to Wendover on the Utah border, to Jackpot on the Idaho border, and around Northeastern Nevada, about 1450 miles, and he kept a brief log for us.

We left Reno on Interstate 80 for Fernley, 34 miles away. We stopped at the Pilot Truck Stop & Casino, Wigwam Restaurant & Casino, Silverado Restaurant & Casino, and the Truck Inn Restaurant & Casino. All were small slots only casinos. From Fernley, we headed for Lovelock, 60 miles away. Sturgeon's Casino was the only casino open. We passed the closed Felix's Bank club. Then, on to Mill City, 59 miles away. Only one small slots-only casino in Burns Bros. Truck Stop. Winnemucca, 29 miles from Mill City, was our next stop. This is one of the bigger towns on Interstate 80. The Legend's Casino, Model T Casino, Red Lion Inn Casino, and Sundance Casino were larger and had more slots but they were still slots-only casinos. Winner's Hotel\Casino has blackjack games but no \$1 chips. The owner of the Sundance Casino is reported to have a batch of old \$2.50 chips but he will not sell them.

From Winnemucca, we headed to Battle Mountain, 54 miles away. This was the saddest town on our trip. Half the town was boarded up. The Colt Service Center is a small slot-only casino with a restaurant on the side. The Nevada Hotel has a few slots without even a dollar slot machine. We just missed the Owl Casino, which closed June 30, 1999. Next, on to Carlin, 49 miles away. The only casino was a slots-only casino, the Pilot Casino & Truck Stop, which is related to the one in Fernley. Elko was only 23 miles down the road. Gold Country uses one dollar tokens on their blackjack table. The Red Lion Inn has slots and table games. We were told that these two casinos, along with the Red Lion Inn in Winnemucca have the same ownership. From Elko, we headed to Wells, 51 miles away. The only open casino, 4-Way Casino uses token on

their blackjack tables. We passed by the closed Rest Inn Suites and Ranch Crest Inn casinos. Wendover was another 58 miles down the road. Inside the casinos, you would think you were in Las Vegas casinos. The Rainbow Casino, Peppermill Casino, Stateline Casino, and Silver Smith Casino have slots and table games. The Rainbow Casino was the nicest, the Red Garter Casino is in need of remodeling.

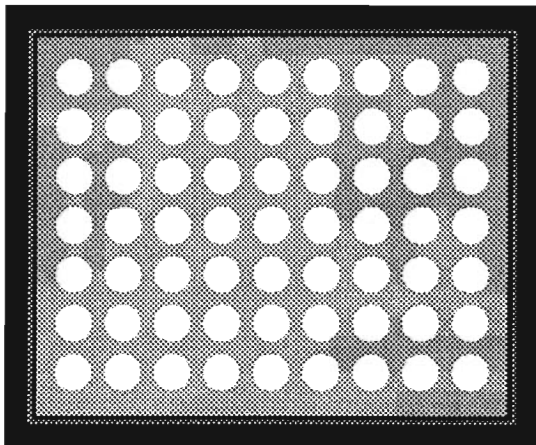
We then backtracked on Interstate 80 to Wells and then turned north on Highway 93 towards Jackpot, another 67 miles away. The casinos in Jackpot are on par with those in Reno. Barton's Club 93 has a lot of slots and table games. The Horshu Casino has slots and a few blackjack tables. Four Jacks Casino has slots only but no dollar tokens. The Pony Express is a small slots-only casino. We again back-tracked on Highway 93 to Interstate 80 and then west toward Reno. About 23 miles after passing Lovelock, we turned south at Highway 95, and headed for Fallon, 33 miles away. In Fallon, the Bonanza Inn Casino, Depot Casino, and Fallon Nugget have slots and gaming tables. The smallest casino we visited on our trip was the Headquarters Bar. It has two blackjack tables and a few slots. Ms. Dee Sutton wins the award for the friendliest casino employee we met on our trip.

The freeways were great and the speed limit was 75 mph. We had a very enjoyable and interesting trip!
