Standard Plaques & Jetons

Illustrated below are our simplest form of jetons and plaques. These are available in a huge variety of colours as are all our jetons and plaques. The jetons and plaques shown are convenient for use with small values.

The standard finish is mother of pearl. Our expertise in printing allows you to customize both sides of the jeton or plaque. An example would be the name of the casino including the value and an image such as a building, landscape or logo. The printing is embedded in the plaque or jeton and therefore is immune to wear or scratching.

The two most common printed colours are black and gold. Other colours are available on request.



Backgrounds & Finishes

It is the choice of colours and finishes which make our jetons and plaques so unique.

We offer jetons and plaques made with one colour or with two or three different colours. This can be combined with various types of finishes:

- * Mother of pearl
- * White lace which can be overlaid on the mother of pearl
- * Gold lace which enhances both the aesthetic and security aspects of the jetons and plaques.
- * Lamé which offers the brightest finish

The above options may be combined with our 28 colours in combinations of two or three colours. This gives you the possibility of 222 combinations of finishes.

Please note: due to the restrictions of photography and printing the samples shown below in no way represent the fine finish which we achieve on our jetons and plaques.

Plaques & Jetons two stripes or three stripes

Illustrated here are two and three stripe plaques. You may choose from 28 colours. The colours can run vertically or horizontally. This applies to round, square, oblong and oval jetons and plaques.

Plaques & Jetons with lunettes

Having selected the type of finish, the combination of colours and printing that you require you may now wish to add lunettes to your jeton or plaque. These lunettes are manufactured from a contrasting material and are inserted into the jeton or plaque. Normally they are made from a see through material and are decorated to increase both the security aspect and visual appeal. One, two or three lunettes can be inserted in the plaque and can be placed independently. A lunette can be blank or printed. Usually the style and colour of the lunette is selected by our designer, but if you wish you may select the finish yourself.

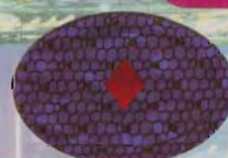


Plaques & Jetons with lunettes

To further improve the security and visual appeal of our jetons and plaques we offer the option of using overlapping lunettes. The lunettes can be made from a combination of materials and as before can be printed or plain.



We can produce lunettes in various shapes as illustrated to even further enhance your plaques or jetons.

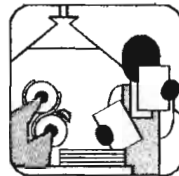

Need more collecting activities? Join a Chapter!

Casino chip, token and memorabilia collecting is a fast growing hobby. We all know that the annual CC>CC convention is the highlight of the year. But what is there to do the rest of the year to build your collection and relate with other collectors?

For those of us who are connected to the Internet, there many activities that you can participate in daily. You can visit chip auction sites, converse with other chippers on the Club's Bulletin Board or on Greg Susong's ChipBoard, read articles about chipping on Chequers or visit other chippers web sites to look at their trade and sale lists.

If you are lucky enough to live near one, you can attend a Chip Show. There are shows regularly held in Las Vegas and Southern California. There have been others held from time to time in Biloxi, Chicago, Ocean City, NJ, and Northern Nevada. Occasionally you can also pick up chips at a coin or antique show. Finally, you can go on a chip run.

Well what else is there to do? Join a chapter! There are many chapters of the CC>CC all around the country. Some are very active and have meetings scheduled every month, others meet every other month or perhaps less often. The Atlantic City chapter is the largest with over 300 members. The bimonthly meetings attract over 100 members for trading, sales, auction, raffles and presentations from various speakers in the hobby or casino industry. The smallest chapter, that I know of, is the New York State chapter that started out with only 5 members. You don't have to be big to have fun.

How do you locate a chapter near you? I've compiled a list of casino chip chapters or clubs from various sources. The information is tough to keep current and I would appreciate any updates to the list. Please send them to me at ckaplan@attglobal.net. If you are not on-line, you can write or call the chapter contact to find out when the chapter meets and what to expect when you attend a meeting. Most chapters have minimal dues, \$5.00 or so a year, just to cover the cost to mail meeting notices.

What if there isn't a chapter near you? Start your own chapter! It's no big deal. First, contact the club's Membership Officer, James Steffner. He can provide you with the requirements for starting a chapter and a list of club members in your area. The biggest concern is finding a place to meet. My chapter's first meeting was at my home. When we decided to form the chapter and needed a better meeting location, one of our members volunteered his American Legion Hall for our bimonthly meetings. If there is a nearby casino, most are happy to provide a meeting room for casino related activities at little or no cost.

So if you want chip and token collecting activities all year long, find a nearby chapter or start your own.

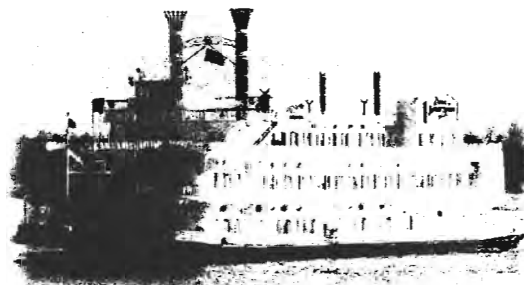

ATLANTIC CITY REPORT

My first order of business is to express my sincere personal thanks to out-going club magazine Editor, Gregg Herz, for her devotion and dedication to the club publication and secondly, to offer a warm welcome to the new Editor, John Yee. The club has lost a very talented and innovative Editor in Gregg, but it would appear that a very capable replacement has been found in John. Best wishes to both of you from the Blacks' household.

The highlight of the previous quarter was the release of the now famous Will Espin chip, which brought a top bid of \$102.50 on Ebay and many, many bids between \$50 - \$125 in my A.C. New Issues Service auction. It's still too early to determine where the value of this relatively scarce chip will eventually level out up or down. As of this writing, (mid-May) I have none left for sale in inventory.

Picking up where we left off since the last magazine issue, Claridge continues to be the dominant chip-issuing leader in Atlantic City. An issue of 1,000 \$5 and 500 \$10 St. Patrick's Day chip were released in March from a specially designated roulette table.

Also in March, A.C. chippers saw a Taj Mahal \$100 Millennium chip of only 100 in quantity offered. I was extended an opportunity to purchase a stack of 20 chips to be distributed at face value to those in attendance at the Atlantic City Chapter March meeting. When those in attendance were asked to stand if they collected \$100 A.C. chips, only 14 stood up and each were given a slip of paper that could be exchanged with \$100 cash for the new "The Donald" millennium chip. In addition, three names were also drawn at random from a hat for three additional chips awarded to the rest of the members in attendance who expressed interest in purchasing the \$100 millennium chip at face value.

April was a very quiet month, as no chips were issued in A.C. until the very end of the month. Claridge issued the first of eight Lighthouse series chips. The first chips, again a \$5 and \$10 denomination in 1,000 and 500 quantities respectively, featured the Fire Island New York Lighthouse. The

2nd chip in the series was nearby Barnegat Lighthouse, Long Beach Island, NJ, which was issued in late May. Tentatively scheduled for release are the following: Sandy Hook Lighthouse (New Jersey) in June; Absecon Lighthouse (Atlantic City) in July; Cape May Lighthouse (NJ) in August; Thomas Point Lighthouse (Maryland) in September; Seven Fort Knoll Lighthouse (Baltimore) in October; and finishing up the series in November will be the Sandy Point Shoal Lighthouse (Maryland). All \$5 chips are to be issued in quantities of 1,000 while the \$10 chips will have issues of just 500.

A surprise variation of an existing chip was reported by Russell Diaz, of Brigantine. It would appear that the \$1 Harrah's Marina regular table chip has been re-issued. The "i" in Marina and "i" in Casino are completely different (smaller) on the new version compared to the i's on the older original chips. Additionally, if both chips are viewed outdoors in broad daylight with the naked eye, the newer "mini-i chip" will have a violet-purple hue to the otherwise gray ring surrounding the metal center.

For the A.C. token collectors; we have finally found something to maintain interest in our collections. A brand new \$2 slot token has been issued at Tropicana. The older TropWorld \$2 tokens have all been removed from play.

I'm also told, by a very knowledgeable slot attendant, that .50 tokens at Trop are on the way. Another casino in town succumbs to the elimination of Kennedy half-dollars. I'm reasonably certain that more casinos will follow suit and change over their 50 machines to accept .50 tokens instead of half-dollars.

Chippers are patiently awaiting the release of a \$5 & \$10 4th of July issue from Claridge; a \$10 Van Halen chip in their "Rock The Dock Series" at Trump Marina; and a \$5 Chinese New Year chip issue at Trump's Taj Mahal.

Hope to see many of you at the 8th Annual Convention in Las Vegas this July.

California Chips

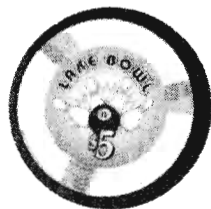

Probably the biggest chip news in the Golden State during the last quarter is that the Viejas Indians, who operate a casino near San Diego, began operating a gambling ship in April. The ship is the MV Enchanted Sun, operated by Commodore Cruise Lines, and traveled from San Diego to Rosarita Beach in Baja California. The Bud Jones chips are in denominations of \$100, \$25, \$5 and \$1. The ship also uses a \$1 gold-tone token and a 25 cent silver-tone token. The boat suspended service due to lack of customers on June 2 after only seven weeks of operation. Part of the problem was the ship was supposed to dock at the Rosarita Beach hotel but high swells prevented this. One report said the Viejas tribe had invested \$8 million in the gambling ship scheme.



The cardroom in the Lake Bowl in Folsom, which closed late last year, has reopened with a new rack with a bowling design. Most collectors seem to like the old Suicide King chips better.



The Saigon Casino in Stockton has issued a \$5 chip with a Suicide King design on one side and Pai Gow tiles on the reverse. No word as of this writing on other chips from the club.



Garden City and Bay 101 have been threatened with being closed down by the city of San Jose. A number of employees were arrested at each club on various charges related to alleged loan sharking going on at the casinos. Garden City changed their \$1 chip from their new rack. Apparently the purple color was coming off on player's hands so it was replaced with a blue chip of the same design and a slightly smaller inlay.

Lucky Chances in Colma called back their new Bud Jones greenish \$100 chip when it was discovered that the Oaks in Emeryville is using a \$3 chip that looked exactly like it in a stack or rack. For now, they have gone back to the old Chipcos for all denominations except for the \$20, which is the new Bud Jones. Expect to see all the Lucky Chances chips change to the Bud Jones before long, though. Not sure if any of the green \$100s got out. Aren't too many collectors of California \$100s so it seem doubtful many exist.

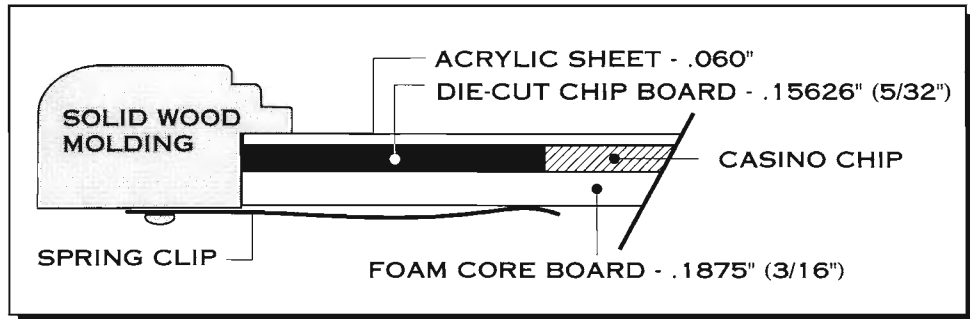

Donald Trump tried to buy it, but the Commission rejected his license application. The Station Casino made a bid but later withdrew it. Now the Isle of Capri will be taking over the Flamingo effective June 5, 2000. They also have an application for license to build a casino in Booneville, Missouri as well as one in St. Louis County.

Harrah's had purchased Sam's Town and then closed it, hoping to increase their market share of the Kansas City gaming business. It didn't work. In the St. Louis area, they bought the Players Island Casino.

All this jockeying around leaves only President on the Admiral, St. Louis and St. Joseph's Frontier Casino at St. Joseph as not having changed ownership.

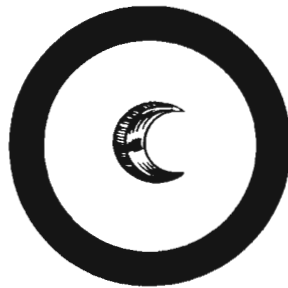


This issue will be devoted to letting you know what new antique chips have recently been found. Both clay and ivory chips seem to be harder to find, but new designs keep appearing.

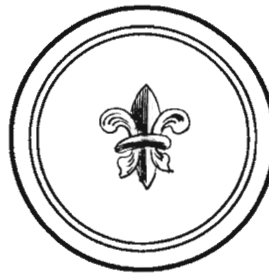

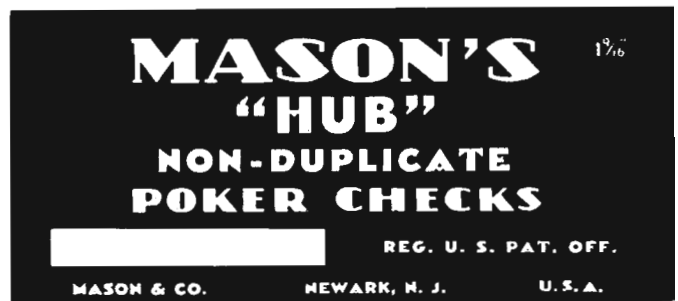
Collecting in the World of French Style Gaming Plaques & Jetons

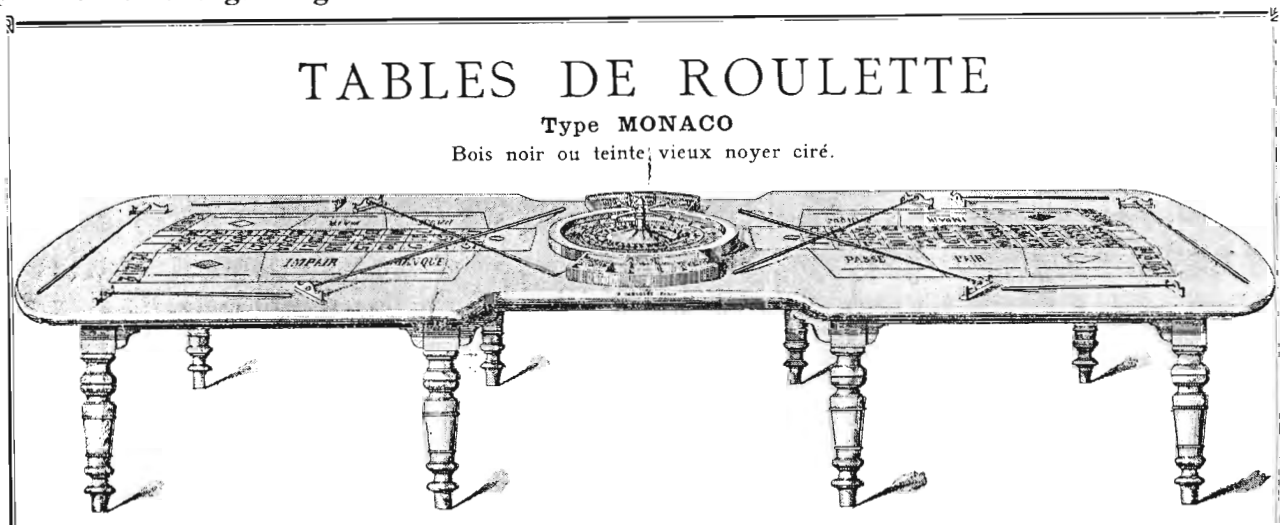


"*Breaking the Bank at Monte Carlo*" has been the dream of almost every gambler and only in recent years has Las Vegas risen to the level of legend in gaming circles that Monte Carlo once exclusively enjoyed. To collectors who enjoy the uniformity of the 39mm round American style gaming check, French plaques and jetons can be a mystery - but one that offers a great amount of satisfaction in collecting with some understanding and history.

There are two basic styles of gaming that predominate in the world. American Style developed around the game of craps - a fast paced dice game that began in the alleys of areas like East St. Louis, Missouri or New York City. The gaming checks that were developed for American Style were uniformly sized around 1-1/2" to 1-9/16" in diameter.



French Style gaming developed in exclusive salons around the games of Chemin de fer and Roulette. The style and atmosphere of the salons reflected leisure and elegance. Players used *jetons* and *plaques* in place of money and these reflected the splendor of the gaming houses.



Technically, jetons are round and usually have a diameter between 32mm and 60mm. Plaques are rectangular, oval or square and generally vary in sizes from 38mm to 151mm. French style gaming uses size as well as color to differentiate denominations. Materials of manufacture range from ivory, bone and mother-of-pearl to plastic. Designs are frequently elaborate and beautiful and reflect the elegance associated with French style.



As American gaming spreads around the world, its uniformly sized checks and chips dominate games like craps and blackjack. Where speed is the objective to give the house a more frequent chance at the player's money, only color defines the differences in value. American style gaming is a relatively recent development that has grown since the 1930's. It is French style gaming that has historically been associated with style and class while American Style reflects a sense of wild fun and amusement.

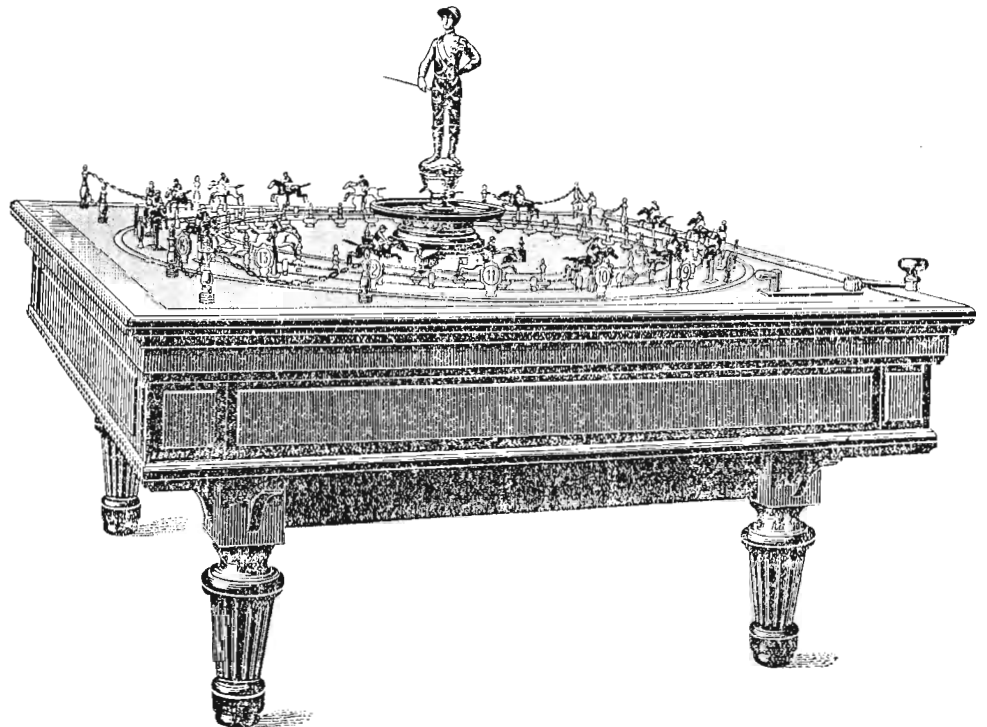
When the Sahara Hotel in Las Vegas sought to introduce the sophisticated game of baccarat in the early 1960's, they originally imitated the French Style and used both jetons and plaques. The game was not a success as customers were used to the fast paced and frantic play that craps generated. The elegant and sophisticated French style seemed to be too slow and the games were withdrawn for lack of players. The Sands Hotel also brought in baccarat with the same results as the Sahara.

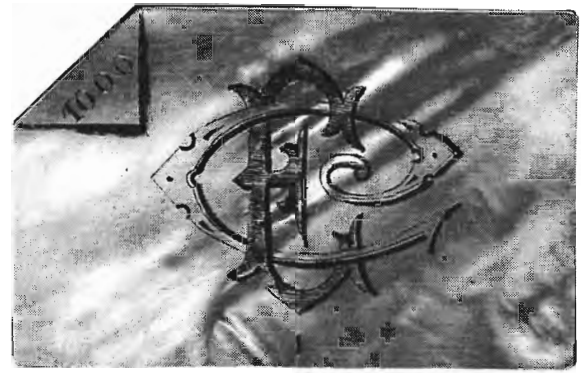


In the 1970's and 80's, baccarat was Americanized with the elegant long tables reduced to blackjack size and the play accelerated with American style checks. As the number of international players began to flow to Las Vegas, the large French style tables were again introduced, but the play is not conducted with the elegance and leisure of the last century that prevailed in Monte Carlo - only the size of the bets are legendary.

Despite the inroads that American gaming has made in traditional French style gaming houses, the elegance and flare of jetons and plaques continues to be a draw to collectors. French style jetons and plaques are usually issued in uniform sets with the higher denominations becoming more elaborate. The lack of uniform size may discourage some collectors who like the tidiness of having all of their chips and checks fit in one size holder. The range of color and beauty more than make up for the inconvenience that the size variations cause.

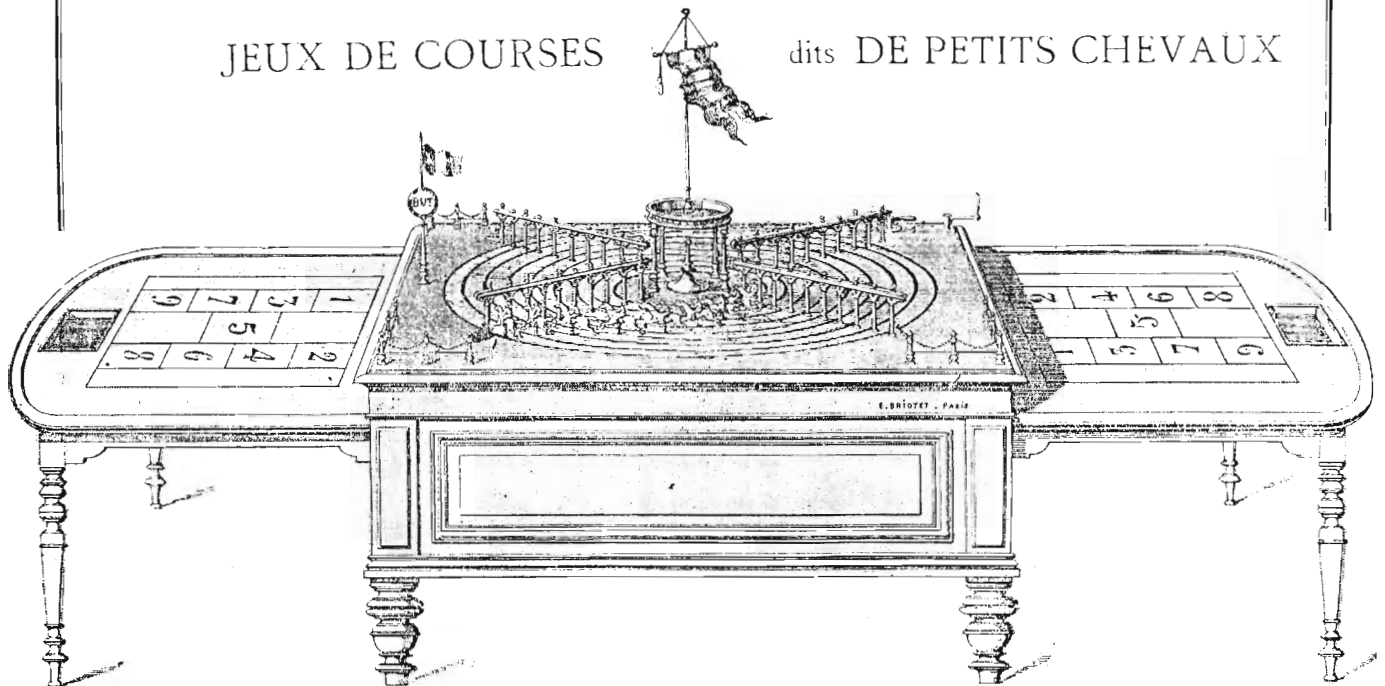

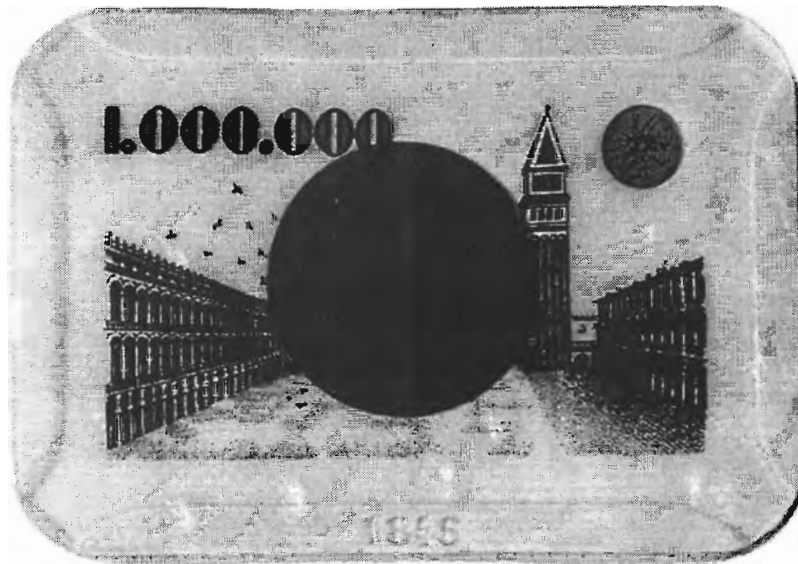

Besides the plastic, ivory and other non-metallic materials, casino jetons can be found in a large number of metals. These metallic "tokens" are an integral part of the money of French style casinos and are as collectible as are the plaques and non-metallic jetons.



Collectors who wish to accurately describe their French style jetons and plaques are directed to the excellent descriptions that have been reprinted on the inside front and inside back covers of this issue. These descriptions, provided with the permission of *Bourgogne et Grasset* from their catalog, give the basic terminology that the manufacturer uses for the various parts of their jetons and plaques. These catalog reproductions have been reduced by 50%. The illustrations of the gaming equipment from the last century are from the catalog of G. Caro of Paris circa 1900.
